# Friends of the Cape Coral Library Meeting January 16, 2016

"Oh the Things You Can Do: Volunteering in the Cape"

Friends meetings begin at 9:30 a.m. with coffee, juice and snacks. There will be a short business meeting at 10:00 a.m. followed by the program "Oh the Things You Can Do: Volunteering in the Cape".

Four Cape Coral organizations will be featured:

The Cape Coral Lee County Public Library is one of six regional libraries serving Lee County. The library has an arts and humanities emphasis with The Friends of the Library providing a monthly art gallery exhibit featuring local artists. A butterfly garden with a fountain is located outside along with several areas for quiet reading. There is a large meeting room, small conference room, public Internet access, and wireless and wired Internet access for laptops. The library serves a large youth population with a variety of free programming for toddlers through teens.

<u>The Friends of the Cape Coral Library</u> is a non-profit organization dedicated to enhancing the resources and services of the Cape Coral Library. The Friends raise funds for supporting programs and purchasing materials for the library that are not covered by the Lee County budget. As library advocates, members speak out in support of local, state, and national libraries.

<u>Southwest Florida Military Museum & Library</u> honors United States soldiers, preserves military history and educates today's and future generations the true meaning of military service and sacrifice. Through authentic artifacts, displayed in a variety of formats throughout the museum, viewers can bear witness to the experiences and sacrifices of past members of U.S. Armed Forces. Museum exhibits cover every aspect of military service from the Revolutionary War to the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan. The museum is a tribute to U.S. military heritage and those who have served in the military, during peacetime and in war.

<u>Cape Coral Friends of Wildlife</u> is a volunteer organization whose purpose is to preserve and enhance the habitats of protected wildlife species and to educate the community about Cape Coral's wildlife resources. Projects include a starter burrow program, adopt-a-burrow, staking days, and the locally famous annual burrowing owl festival, scheduled for February 27, 2016.

Speakers will present, answer questions and have materials available. The Cape Coral Library will display topic-related books, dvds and audios for checkout. Meetings are held in the large meeting room at the Cape Coral Library, 921 SW 39<sup>th</sup> Terrace, Cape Coral. Friends meetings are free and open to the public. # Special Event in the Library on January 9 from 1:00 to 4:30 PM

The Weavers of Char-Lee will hold their 12<sup>th</sup> annual Roc Day Celebration on Saturday, January 9<sup>th</sup> from 1:00 to 4:30 PM in the hallway of the library's art gallery. There will be a variety of activities and demonstrations. Roc Day is celebrated worldwide as the day when weavers and spinners bring their looms and wheels out of storage to resume their craft following the Twelve Days of Christmas. (The "roc" is the distaff on a spinning wheel which holds the wool or flax for spinning.) This event at the library has been extremely popular in past years. So make sure you head over in the afternoon on January 9<sup>th</sup> to join the excitement.

## February 1 through February 28, 2016

Artwork by members of the **Portrait and Figure Painters Society of SW Florida (PFPS)** will be displayed on the walls of the library's art gallery. This is a double-themed exhibit. The first theme is "Faces of all Ages". The second part will feature portraits of "Babies, Children and Youths". As is revealed in its mission statement, the society strives to promote, stimulate and foster creative fine art painting in various media and styles and "to encourage and promote fine portrait and figure artists, teachers, students, our communities - national and international- in their professional growth and success." The PFPS most recently received accolades for its Art

Expo exhibit at the prestigious Sidney & Berne Davis Art Center in Fort Myers this September. The exhibit showcased paintings by ten of the society's professional, award-winning fine artists.

On display in the library gallery case for the month of February, find glass creations by **Patty Arenburg**. Patty has had a life-long interest in art. Upon retiring several years ago, Patty discovered fused glass and became fascinated by the medium, which continues to amaze her by its beauty. Arenburg's work has been accepted into juried shows at the von Liebig Art Center in Naples, the Art Center of Marco Island and the Cape Coral Art Studio Gallery.

Artisan Jewelry by **Sandy Jones** will be on display in the gallery. Sandy infuses each piece with color energy by "soaking" them in both moonlight and sunlight. She points out that "Color is, quite simply, vibration that the eye recognizes, and of course can have a profound impact on our attitude!" The stones Sandy uses are semi-precious, and most are hand-cut. The pearls are freshwater, the silver is sterling and the gold is gold filled. She tries to apply as much positive energy as possible into each of her beautiful pieces.

Also on display in the small case, enjoy unique handcrafted cards by **Dona Malone**. A Cape Coral resident since 2003, Dona is enthusiastic about rubber stamping and employs this technique in creating her charming cards.
