And if the these programs weren't enough, our meeting, Saturday, January 17, will feature Thea Rosenbaum, who will talk about her experiences and her book, No Place for a Lady. This presentation, and book, tells (and shows) Thea's

experience as a small girl who escaped the Soviets with her mother in Berlin in 1945. She went on to become Germany's first woman stockbroker at Oppenheimer and Co., and also Germany's only woman war correspondent in Vietnam.

Can you believe it? The quality of these programs? And they're all made possible by you, the Friends. 
Notes and Books

Ms.

January 3 to January 31, 2015

Watercolor paintings by *Madonna (Donna) Maves* will be on display during the month of January. After teaching school in Bloomington, MN for 35 years, Donna combined her love of teaching and passion for watercolor into her new retirement career- instructing adults in that medium. Donna works in her own studio at her lake home in Minnesota, where she and her husband live for six months during the summer, and teaches watercolor classes here at the Cape Coral Art League for the other half of the year. Donna's paintings exemplify the wide range of effects that can be accomplished using watercolor, and she teaches her students how to apply these techniques in their artwork.

Sarah L. Stoneking is sharing the gallery space this month with her long-time friend Donna Maves. As Sarah explains her own background, she always loved art and the masters ever since taking Art History in college and would talk to her elementary school students about Degas, Monet, Rembrandt and other painters as if they were her friends. After retiring, Sarah discovered watercolors and has been dedicating herself to exploring the medium. A "snowbird" from Minnesota, Sarah spends the winter months taking weekly lessons in watercolor and participating in workshops taught by nationally known artists at the Cape Coral Art League.

Doll house miniature room boxes and other hand-made miniature displays by *Jacqui Grindley* will be on exhibit in the tall cases. Jacqui began her creative endeavors over 30 years ago to occupy her time while her infant son was sleeping and continues to immerse herself in her hobby. She employs a variety of materials such as Fimo clay, air-dried clay, wood, fabrics, paint, stains, synthetic moss, and even real tree branches. Jacqui Grindley is a member of N.A.M.E., the National Association of Miniature Enthusiasts.

Maria L. Salazar will display her decorative spoons and forks, which she describes as "gold toned, elegant, classy and very feminine." Visitors to the gallery will enjoy viewing her fun, colorful and unique creations.

Paintings and photographs by members of the *Cape Coral Art League* will be on display on the walls of the library's art gallery.
